Bursary

Students in the Sixth Form can apply for a bursary. The discretionary Post-16 Bursary is funding which is allocated to those students who meet the eligibility criteria to alleviate barriers to their education. The bursary fund is used to provide support with transport costs and business wear. Application forms and eligibility criteria will be issued at the start of each academic year.

<u>Dress</u>

At Corby Business Academy we believe a smart appearance is very important. Students in the Sixth Form are to wear smart business wear during the school day. Students will continue to wear the Academy PE Kit in their Active lessons.

<u>Transport</u>

Students in the Sixth Form can apply for SEN transport through the NCC website. Applications must be completed by May each academic year. A reminder will be sent out in April.









<u>Curriculum</u>

The Sixth Form curriculum builds on previous learning in life and functional skills so that each student becomes more prepared for the transition into adulthood as well as developing employability skills and promoting independence. Students will follow a highly differentiated personal pathway and develop a healthy, safer lifestyle. Social skills and a focus on real world application including community visits, use of money and safe travel are embedded across the curriculum.



The curriculum is enriched by a range of creative and physical education activities and opportunities including the Young Enterprise Team Programme and Panathlon Challenge.

To help prepare students for life beyond school they can undertake work experience in the local community and within the school environment as well as participate in taster sessions at local colleges and post 18 provisions.

Note: Entry Level accreditation in Life Skills is based on knowledge and Functional Skills accreditation is based on applying skills. Personal Progress qualification is for students working at Entry 1 or below.
