


3D DESIGN

1. Make a series of drawings of the object resources focusing on the light and shade and the cast shadows using the 3 methods illustrated





Different marks can be used to make tonal shading: hatching, cross-hatching and scribbling for example

EXPECTATIONS


DEVELOP: complete at least 1 extended drawing or several shorter ones

Compare the affect media has on your drawing results




Contextual artist: why not research Giorgio Morandi?

Pencils are graded according to the proportion of clay to graphite they contain: higher the 'B' numbers contain more graphite, are softer and therefore make a darker mark GRAPHICS

Identify your characteristics so that you can visualise them in your use of visual language





