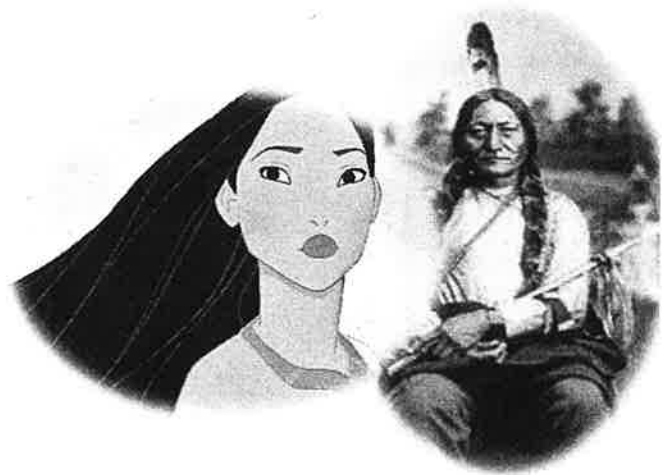

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The Europeans came in their hundreds and their horses destroyed farm lands

The Native Americans were pushed out of their own territories by the settlers

The Settlers wanted new homes and gold to make them rich

The gold was where the Native Americans lived so the settlers tried to force them out

The Natives traded animal fur like sea otter in return for European goods. So much hunting happened the sea otter was almost extinct by 1820.

In the 19th century too many people lived in America so they started expanding West towards California (the Americans belief that this was acceptable was called manifest destiny)

The Native Americans wanted to trade with the settlers in some cases. This was for iron in particular given that iron was better than wood, bone and teeth for weapons and shelter.

The Europeans brought diseases the Natives had no immunity to. Even colds could kill a Native

Settlers were sometimes engaged in violence with the Natives, some were engaged in trading

The settlers started killing the buffalo so there wasn't enough left for the Native Americans
