Homework within Health and Social Care enables students to:

- Show progress and understanding
- Enhance students study skills e.g. planning, time management and self discipline
- · Take ownership and responsibility for their own learning
- Promotes enjoyment of learning for its own sake

Types of homework

Years 10 and 11 BTEC Tech Award:

Years 12 and 13 BTEC Level 3 Extended Certificate Award:

It is an expectation that all students studying Health and Social Care will spend a
minimum of 90 minutes each fortnight on home work. The key focus is to develop
further extended knowledge and research for coursework, so that students are
able to analyse and evaluative given topics from the Health and Social Care
curriculum.

Non-completion of homework

Parents/Carers roles in homework
