The purpose of homework is

- To develop students' fluency and understanding of key mathematical concepts
- To provide students with opportunities to revisit and consolidate key concepts
- To provide students with opportunities to apply the concepts to different scenarios

Homework within Mathematics enables students to:

- Develop problem solving skills
- Develop wider study skills
- Be responsible for their own learning

The amount of homework

Subject:	Years	Amount of time allocated for Mathematics homework each week at Corby Business Academy:
Mathematics	10 and 11	45 minutes
Mathematics	7 – 9	30 minutes

Years 10 and 11 - GCSE:

It is an expectation that all Y11 students will spend a minimum of 45 minutes each week on Mathematics homework. The key focus is to build exam skills and consolidate knowledge of topics taught in previous years.

Years 7, 8 and 9 - KS3:

It is an expectation that all Y7 and Y8 students will spend a minimum of 30 minutes each week on homework. The key focus is to consolidate knowledge taught in lessons and retrieve previous learning

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Types of homework
