### **The purpose of homework is**

The purpose of the homework is to:

- encourage independent study skills through learning and practice of topics
- ensure learning and practice of key vocabulary, as well as themes and notions studied in school

Some homework will be designed as an opportunity to discover other countries' cultural capital and heritage.

### **The amount of homework**

Vocabulary learning will be set on a weekly basis, and is likely to take 30 minutes or less.

Cultural homework will be set on a termly basis, and is likely to take 1-2 hours.

### **Types of homework**

Years 7-9 will be given vocabulary lists to learn, and practice on an ad hoc basis.

Years 10-11 will be given vocab practice, GCSE questions as well as exams skills practice.

Years 12-13 will be given a mixture of essays, research, grammar practice and vocabulary learning.

Homework will include a mixture of online and paper tasks.

### **Non-completion of homework**

- If homework is not completed on time, students' parents will receive a text message home.



- If students miss two homework tasks in a row then a session 5 is set to ensure students are bridging gaps in their learning

## **Parents/Carers roles in Homework**

The parents/carers roles in homework is to encourage students to set aside time with no distractions in order to complete their homework task.

Parents and carers will be able to keep up to date with homework deadlines and topic related information.

## **Students responsibility**

- Students need to record the homework
- Students need to meet the homework deadline
- Problems with homework should be resolved before the deadline
