- Use geographic techniques and perspectives to address a variety of contemporary issues such as demographic changes, economic inequality, environmental justice, urbanization, and more
- Understand and appreciate the value of different cultures and perspectives

Student will receive regular feedback to ensure they are maximising their independent learning time.

Students will receive two pieces of homework/independent research tasks each week. We will be encouraging to create opinions fusing higher level thinking skills and show students grasp of complex issues through report and essay writing.


