Corby Business Academy Uniform Expectations: Term 6

As is customary when we enter the warmer months, we will be making some temporary alterations to our uniform expectations for this coming term. For Term 6 only we will be allowing students to come to school without their school blazer or jumper if they so wish.

However, it is important to note that our high expectations of student uniform, equipment and conduct will not change. Our Heads of Year together with the tutor teams will continue to complete thorough checks of student uniform daily. Our full expectations can be found on our website using the link below.

Some common issues we saw last term that we will be challenging robustly next term are below:

- Students wearing trainers rather than appropriate school shoes. These are only permitted for brief periods when there is medical evidence provided by a parent.
- Students not wearing Academy ties.
- Students wearing jogging bottoms or leggings rather than trousers or a skirt.

If standards are not met, you will receive direct contact from your child's tutor or Head of Year to discuss how any identified issues will be addressed.

In some instances, we can support with temporary daily solutions for shoes and ties, which will be kept on the Academy site. However, in these circumstances we will need students to work with us on these arrangements. Please also remember to communicate any issues with your child's Head of Year so we can work in partnership to ensure standards are met. Please be aware that persistent issues or your child's refusal to accept reasonable requests from staff will result in an appropriate sanction being issued.

We have tried to keep our expectations as straight-forward as possible to assist you in making the appropriate choices when purchasing any items of uniform.

Thank you as always for your continued support in this matter, which includes checks at home before students leave for the Academy in the mornings.
